RULES OF ENTRY

Entry is free for all classes listed in this schedule, but pre-entry is required (excluding dog show).

Late entries at organiser's discretion.

Entries to be brought to marquee between **10am and 11.30am** on Saturday 9 August 2025. Please collect entry number from booking team - see Graham & Jane Woodhouse and Christine Bedson.

Judging to start at **noon** prompt. Judges - TBC. Entries will be available for collection from **3.45pm**.

All entries in horticulture classes must be homegrown (entrants to provide own vases for flower classes)

All entries in handicraft classes must be homemade

All entries in Junior classes must be made by entrant, please observe age groups for Junior classes

Placement cards will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each class. Rosettes awarded for Best in Category for Vegetables & Fruits / Flowers / Craft / Cookery. Rosettes will be awarded to all Junior entrants.

Dog show entries to meet at assembly point (behind stage) when classes are announced. Rosette awarded to each category winner. Dogs must be kept under close control AND on a lead at all times. Please take all reasonable steps to ensure wellbeing of dogs while on site. Water is available from the pavilion.

JUDGING WILL BE ANONYMOUS AND ALL JUDGES' DECISIONS ARE FINAL

Volunteers and organisers may enter classes excluding any classes where they are a designated judge.
